

NORTHERN BAY COLLEGE ASPIRATION AND ACHIEVEMENT POLICY NBC065

1. Purpose:

- 1.1. Northern Bay College values participation in school life leading towards successful learning pathways. These pathways are often difficult for reasons of financial or socio / cultural issues.
- 1.2. The College promotes aspiration to lifelong learning and experiences.
- 1.3. The College has sought, and is offered, partnerships with organisations with similar values to provide monetary or in-kind support for aspiring and achieving students.

2. Guidelines:

- 2.1. The College will have no financial involvement in programs nominated as Aspirational and Achievement programs (A and A programs). Any financial support will be provided by partners or organisations in receipt of funding / philanthropy.
- 2.2. If financial implications of the program are required this must be submitted for a Budget approval prior to signing of and promotion.
- 2.3. Students may be selected or recommended by Campus Staff, Campus Leadership Teams and/or College Leadership Team.
- 2.4. Students may be required to follow an application process. Academic achievement or aspiration is required to present previous results to qualify.
- 2.5. All Aspiration and Achievement awardees will have clear discussions regarding pathways rationale and conditions (if Applicable)
- 2.6. Clear criteria, conditions and participation guidelines will be transparent and meticulously followed.

3. Implementation:

- 3.1. All Programs will require the identification of a College employed Coordinator. This College Level coordinator may have a range of roles from simple point of contact with program coordinator to leading the initiative.
- 3.2. Where a selection process is undertaken for the A and A program the nominated coordinator is required to oversee all actions and liaise with appropriate stakeholders.
- 3.3. Any A and A program that has an external funding component needs to be discussed and organised by the nominated Coordinator.
- 3.4. All A and A programs that have external connections to the College, e.g. Deakin, require communication and liaison between the college and the provider.
- 3.5. All programs that require an Event will need to be created on Compass by persons responsible following College processes.
- 3.6. All publicity is to be communicated with College Liaison Officer for internal and external publications by the coordinator.
- 3.7. Any Event presentations, launches and/or special occasions will be coordinated by nominated Coordinator.

4. Evaluation:

- 4.1. This policy will be reviewed regularly as part of the school's three-year review cycle.
